

# About Build Haiti Foundation

Founded in 2006 by a group of Haitian entrepreneurs in Maryland, the Build Haiti Foundation is dedicated to working with the Haitian diaspora and friends of Haiti to address the challenges facing the majority of Haitian people in Haiti.

Since the 2010 earthquake, which devastated Haiti's capital of Port au Prince, the Build Haiti Foundation has undertaken



projects in Haiti that have had a direct impact on the lives of Haitians in the northern village of Camp Coq, approximately an hour's drive west from Cap

Haitien, the second largest city in Haiti.

Since the summer of 2015, BHF President Bob Anantua and David Weeks, Director of Global Education at the Glenelg Country School have developed the Global Leadership Program. This program in early July has empowered the student leaders in the village of Camp Coq in northern Haiti as they have collaborated with their U.S. high school and college age partners. The GLP representatives from Maryland have not only cultivated hope for their Haitian counterparts but also have dedicated themselves to finding the resources to support ongoing local projects associated with the four pillars of the Global Leadership Program namely education, public health, social entrepreneurship and environmental sustainability.

The Build Haiti Foundation has also established a Sister City connection between Columbia in Maryland and Cap Haitian in northern Haiti. With the support of the Columbia Association, meaningful partnerships have been established in the fields of government, health care, business, education and the arts. There is much potential for the sharing of cultures and the resulting enrichment that can be had. the Build Haiti Foundation has been a beacon of promise to Haitians in Haiti.

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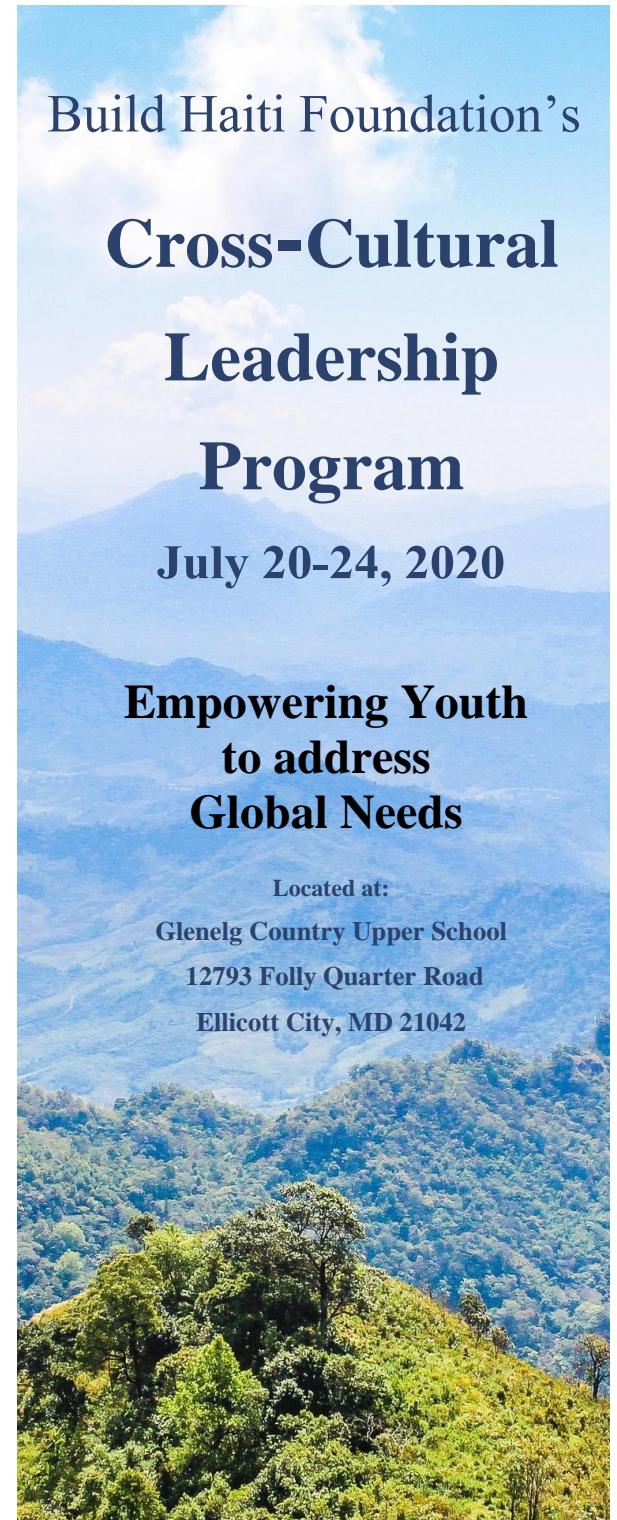
