Working with adult mentors and learning from peer leaders with different cultural perspectives are essential components of the Maryland based Build Haiti Foundation's Global Leadership Program (GLP). Attracting professional adults and high school student leaders with the ability to use their talents for the betterment of the Haitian people, the Build Haiti Foundation is able to partner these participants in its GLP with community minded Haitian adults and students

with leadership potential. Community development and personal leadership will be advanced through interactive discussions on public health, social entrepreneurship and environmental sustainability. Working collaboratively on local service projects and engaging in the support of a local soccer tournament have further strengthened the community spirit of the Haitians involved in the GLP. To empower the GLP Haitian leaders, focus groups have been established to sustain projects through the year that were initiated in collaborative group discussions with GLP participants. Haitians have benefited from this GLP action plan and U.S. participants have become more globally minded and appreciative of their own resources after exposure to Haitian deprivation.
